Greetings Friends in Christ!

We are about a month into the new year, and this is the time when we can really tell if those "resolutions" we may have made are sticking, or if they might be put back on the shelf for next year. A new year's resolution seems like something we are supposed to do, though I am not really sure why, other than it is simply what one does for the new year.

This month, we begin our Lenten Journey together. Perhaps that familiar feeling of the need to "give something up" begins to creep into our minds. There is a long and lovely Lenten history within the church with many different reasons as to why this tradition may have translated to how we understand it now. Maybe our grandparents had a Lenten practice that trickled down generations. Maybe we learned a tradition in a church we loved. All are invited to the Annual Meeting of First Christian Congregational Church that will take place on Sunday, February 11 immediately following morning worship.



What Is A Sabbatical?

The sabbatical is a notion rooted in scripture. In Genesis, God worked for six days creating the universe and its inhabitants, and then rested. Throughout the Old Testament God instructs people to follow this pattern: work and rest. Jesus also departed from the norm many times to seek renewal and strength from God. The sabbatical tradition as we now experience it began in the universities at the time when the university was part of the church. The idea was that the university professors needed one year in every seven to become students again and to refresh their spiritual calling. That tradition is alive and well in secular as well as church-related universities today. Unfortunately, it is not as alive or well in the churches, and most pastors never receive a sabbatical. But friends, we have turned a corner in the life of this church! For the first time in our long 338 year history, our pastor is taking a sabbatical.

What's The Purpose of a Pastor Sabbatical?

In general terms, a sabbatical strengthens and further develops a pastor's ability to serve the church. The results of the sabbatical are transformative for both the pastor and the church:

- **New Perspective.** Perhaps most significant, your pastor will gain a new understanding of the world in which your church ministers. This will deepen her own insight and positively affect her preaching and her service.
- **Spiritual Renewal.** One of the easiest places to dry out spiritually is in the pulpit. A pastor is constantly talking and teaching about the spiritual life. But because it is so much a part of her conversation and work, maintaining and developing her own spiritual needs seems less important. So it is easy to neglect. A pastor sabbatical can be a time to renew spiritual disciplines that got lost in the busy-ness of life.
- **Rest.** Pastor sabbaticals are not vacations. However, intense stress as a result of a vocation where one is "on-call" 24 hours a day needs more than a week or two to break away from. It will take your pastor a month just to allow her body to release the stresses of that level of high-demand, every day ministry.
- **Education.** Whether or not she actually earns any sort of degree or certificate, her sabbatical will be educational. She will learn from her travels, from her research, from new relationships, and from quiet times alone with God.
- Renewed Passion and Vision. All of the above results lead to this. Your pastor will
 return from her sabbatical with a clearer sense of mission and the renewed energy to work
 toward accomplishing it.

What Happens To Us?

During Pastor Holly's sabbatical, The Reverend Doctor Kathleen Henry will be stepping in to serve The Olde White Church part-time. She has served this church before during the interim time before Pastor Holly arrived and is very excited to be with you again. You may even see her on Sundays once in a while as she has popped in to worship with us. She is a regular in the Thrifty Shoppe and participates in our community events when she can. During her time here, Rev. Dr. Henry will care for each of you, fan the Spirit that is alive and well here at The Olde White Church, rejuvenate your church life, support leadership as it explores its strengths, and continue to foster the relationship between us and Pastor Holly in her absence. Sabbatical coverage is a unique calling that requires many different spiritual gifts, all of which Rev. Dr. Henry has honed over the years. Much of her career has been providing Interim and Sabbatical coverages for churches and she is the best around! We are so blessed to have her!

What Happens To Pastor Holly?

Pastor Holly has been planning her sabbatical with us for well over a year. She will begin her sabbatical April 2, 2018 (the day after Easter) and return on July 1, 2018. During this time, she is eager to be able to travel, reconnect with personal relationships, rest, and seek alone time with God. She is also planning to complete her Coaching for Clergy Training and become a credentialed Clergy Coach and begin to transform her dissertation into a book to be published.

Take a minute and talk with her about her sabbatical! Ask lots of questions! Explore what God is doing next for her and for us!
